

Scientists Who Believe – Discussion Guide

Section 1

Discuss what you applied in the past seven days from the last Overflow Show.

Read Colossians 1: 15-17 Discuss what possible scientific claims you see in this passage?

Section 2

Go to www.OverflowShow.com and listen to the 5-minute podcast titled "Scientists Who Believe."

Section 3

What did you think? What stood out to you as you listened?

Have you ever felt marginalized by someone for believing in a scriptural account on a certain issue? Share any instances that you or a friend you know might have experienced.

Which of the quotes from the podcast stood out to you?

Has anyone read a book, heard a speaker, or referenced a website that was supportive of the biblical account about the origins of man, the creation of the world, or other scientific issues? Tell about that.

Which scientific issue is the most troubling or confusing to you as to whether or not the biblical account is accurate?

It is likely that none of us are scientists, but what interesting answers to the issues you just named have you heard?

What are other Bible passages can you think of that are related to science and that would have ramifications regarding scientific issues?

Section 4

Discuss some ways we could apply a few of these principles in the next 7 days?

One suggestion (if needed): Research/show-and-tell week. Each group member choose from one of the below websites and spend 15 minutes on that site this week. Bring back something that struck you as merely interesting and share it with the group next week. We might end 15 minutes early this week to give you those 15 minutes to check out the sites before next week.
